

PENN TOPS BROWN IN IVY OPENER, 28-7

Creeden and Knowlton Pace Quakers to Triumph

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 7—The University of Pennsylvania, its potent offense flickering off and on like a defective light bulb, methodically marched to a 28-7 victory over Brown today in the Ivy League opener for both teams.

Bill Creeden, at quarterback; Cabot Knowlton, at tailback; Gerald Santini, at fullback, and George Burrell, at wingback, supplied flashy offensive efforts that the sparse crowd of 8,861 at cavernous Franklin Field could cheer about.

Mike Chwastyk, a 19-year-old sophomore tackle, and Chris Peterson, a junior end, sparked a fine Penn defensive effort, which had its shutout bid thwarted by Tom Winner's 58-yard punt return for a touchdown in the third period.

They Pile Up Yards

Creeden and Knowlton, two Wharton School of Finance and Commerce seniors, added to impressive individual statistics marks compiled in Penn's 35-23 victory over Lehigh last Saturday. Knowlton again scored twice, while Creeden completed 14 of 33 passes for 184 yards.

As they did against Lehigh, the Quakers scored on their first two series of plays. Creeden passed the Quakers to within scoring range on both drives, capping each drive with a successful pitchout to Knowlton, who scampered 20 and 10 yards around right end for the scores. Santini, a chunky 5-foot-8-inch, 190-pounder, threw the key block on both plays, each time taking the Bruins' left defensive back out of the play.

Creeden, who holds 11 Quaker passing records completed 8 of 13 passes for 87 yards in the first quarter, but found the going much rougher thereafter. Paced by Tom Whidden, a linebacker, and Dan Stewart, the right end, the Bruin line pressured Creeden into overthrowing his targets and slowed Knowlton's end sweeps from then on.

Two Long Gains

The Quaker defense successfully contained the Bruin offense in the first half, except for two long plays, a 46-yard burst up the middle from the 4-yard line by Steve Wormith and a 48-yard passing effort from Mike Maznicki to Greg Kontos. The long pass completion was the key play in a 70-yard Bruin drive, which the Quakers stopped at their 1-yard line.

Another long gainer, Winner's 58-yard scamper down the right sideline, which narrowed the score to 14-7, supplied Brown supporters with their only real bit of excitement in the second half.

The Quakers scored perfunctorily in each quarter. A 32-yard kickoff return by Burrell, and a 55-yard pass play from Creeden to Knowlton set up Penn's third-quarter scoring effort, which was completed by Santini's 1-yard dive off right tackle.

Stewart Eisenhower, a 5-foot-9-inch, 165-pound junior, intercepted a Bruin pass early in the fourth quarter to start the Quakers' final scoring drive. Eisenhower thus stole the fourth of five Bruin passes that the alert Quaker secondary picked off during the game. Creeden then passed 5 yards to Burrell for the score.

Knowlton finished the game with 94 yards gained on 21 carries, while Santini gained 67 on 18.
