

Penn Forfeits to Yale After Dispute on Goal

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 24—A disallowed goal in the second period led Pennsylvania's hockey coach, Jim Salfi, to remove his team from the ice tonight. Yale was awarded a 1-0 forfeit victory in the Ivy League game when the Quakers did not resume play.

The Elis held a 5-0 lead when Vic Ehre apparently scored the first Pennsylvania goal at 14 minutes 58 seconds of the second period. However, an official ruled that a Penn player was in the crease in front of the Yale net and disallowed the tally.

Several Penn players gathered round the two officials to protest and Salfi conferred with the referee. The Penn coach then ordered his players off the ice.
