

PENN TURNS BACK BUCKNELL, 28 TO 17

Rolls Up 25 First Downs in
Outclassing Opponents

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 27 (UPI)—Bill Sudhaus, a solid player for two seasons, scored his first collegiate touchdown today and sent Pennsylvania off to a 28-17 victory over Bucknell at Franklin Field to open the Quakers' 93d football season.

Sudhaus belted over from the 1-yard line in the first quarter, and the Red and Blue went on to a handy victory over the out-classed Bisons in Bob Odell's 100th game as coach in a 12-year career, first at Bucknell and then at Penn.

Dave Graham, an end, supplied the dazzling touch in a game marked by typical opening-day mishaps. He scored on a 74-yard pass play. Bob Long and John Tremba supplied the Penn scores.

Long, who led the freshmen ground-gaining last season, counted from the 2 in the third period, and Tremba, starting in place of the injured Tom Monihan, darted 22 yards in the fourth quarter.

Bucknell, trailing by 28-3, came up with two touchdowns in the final eight minutes, both scored by Dave Vassar following Penn miscues.

The Quakers, using their new "veer" offense, tied a school record of 25 first downs. They rolled 289 yards on the ground and picked up 122 in the air for a net of 411.
