

Penn Beats Lehigh, 13-7, as Berry's Field Goals Provide Winning Margin

PROCACCI INJURED, JAW FRACTURED

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 18 (UPI)—Pennsylvania, shedding quarterbacks like trees shed leaves in the fall, lost Phil Procacci with a broken jaw today but not until the sophomore ran 20 yards for a touchdown that gave the Quakers their start to a 13-7 victory over Lehigh.

Penn's winning points came on a pair of field goals by Eliot Berry, its soccer-style kicking specialist, who booted a 32-yarder in the second quarter to break a 7-7 tie and then kicked a 36-yarder in the fourth quarter. Each was set up by an interception.

The Engineers, seeking their first victory over Penn since 1889, had two opportunities in the final quarter. They reached the Quakers' 26 with nine minutes left, only to have a fourth-down pass batted down, and were at midfield with six minutes left, only to lose the ball on Penn's fourth of five interceptions.

Jaw Broken in 2 Places

Procacci, a backup who became Penn's No. 1 quarterback two weeks ago when Bernie Zbrzezny and Mike Hickok were injured in the Brown game, left the field with his jaw broken in two places in the second quarter.

But in the first quarter he capped a 55-yard march with a 20-yard scamper on an option and went over for the score after he evaded three tacklers.

Lehigh came back with a 68-yard march sparked by a 16-yard pass from Jim Baxter to Mike Leib and a 17-yard advance by Don Diorion before Baxter hit Leib with a 5-yard touchdown pass on the third play of the second quarter.

It set up a 7-7 tie that lasted until Steve Kenoyer intercepted a Baxter pass and carried it to the Lehigh 36. Then the Penn drive stalled, and Berry kicked the tie-breaking field goal.

A third-quarter interception by Denny Malone gave Penn the ball on its 31. Terry Groome, a sophomore quarterback who took over after Procacci was hurt, moved the team to the Lehigh 26, and when the Engineers dug in Berry kicked his 36-yard field goal on the second play of the fourth quarter.
