

# South Carolina 65-52 Victor; Penn Topples Princeton, 75-69

COLUMBIA, S. C., Jan. 5 (AP)—Six baskets by John Ribock in the first half broke the back of North Carolina's shuffle defense and sent third-ranked South Carolina on its way to a 65-52 Atlantic Coast Conference basketball victory tonight.

South Carolina's guard, John Roche, put on a dribbling display in the game's final seven minutes that drew five fouls and helped widen the margin of victory.

A deliberate North Carolina offense, designed to get the ball to its all-American, Charlie Scott, kept the score low. The first half was almost 10 minutes gone when South Carolina finally took the lead, 7-6, and was never headed thereafter.
