

Penn 32-31 Loser

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ITHACA, N. Y., Oct. 10— After trailing for three quarters and looking bad on defense most of the game, Cornell rallied for two touchdowns in the final period to upset Pennsylvania, 32-31, before 14,000 fans today.

It was the Big Red's second straight victory over Penn and to do it Cornell needed to make up a 14-point deficit. The Big Red got a 2-point conversion; a tremendous fourth-quarter 40-yard-pass play from Rick Furbush, the quarterback, to John Bozich, a third-string sophomore fullback, who had shifted to tight end only last week; and brilliant running by Ed Marinaro.

Cornell went into the final period trailing, 31-17, and then Furbush and Marinaro, the nation's leading rusher, went to

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work. In the Big Red's first drive of that final period, they traveled 80 yards on 15 plays with Marinaro going over from the 1 with 8:27 left to play. Marinaro also ran in the 2 points to make the score 31-25.

Penn then was stopped on the 35 and kicked.

Cornell took the ball at its own 36. Marinaro gained 45 yards on three carries, his longest a 33-yarder, but then a Furbush pass to him was incomplete. But on the next play Furbush threw the bomb to Bozich in the end zone to tie the score at 31-all.

After a time out, John Killian added the winning point.

190 Yards for Marinaro

Marinaro finished the day with 190 yards gained in 35 carries, and two touchdowns, but for a good part of the game he was stopped by Penn's seven-man line. Cornell's lack of a passing attack had everybody keying on the 6-foot-2-inch, 210-pound junior from New Milford, N.J.

Marinaro gained only 19 yards in the first period, but ran up 101 in the second quarter, his best period for rushing.

Penn's right tackle, Joe Smugeresky, was instrumental in stopping the Cornell rush, getting 10 tackles, while a right end, Vin Sgro, had eight, Bill Oakerwon, the linebacker, had nine and Dick Cowan, the left end had seven.

In the first half, Penn's defenders were also keeping the pass rush from Pancho Micir, their quarterback who completed 10 of 19 tosses for 167 yards before intermission. But the Big Red made him rush his tosses.

He wound up with 18 for 35 for 246 yards in the second half.

The stiff Penn defense completely bottled up Marinaro in the first quarter, allowing him only 19 yards in seven carries as he tried to run through the middle.

Meanwhile Micir, engineered a 46-yard drive in seven plays

and went in with the first Quaker score himself at 11 minutes 30 seconds of the first period.

Eliot Berry, a senior soccer-style kicker, added the extra point and then added a 36-yard field goal at 1:22 of the second to give Penn a 10-0 lead.

The Big Red scored its first points at 8:55 of the second quarter as Killian, a shoeless American style kicker, put one between the crossbars from the 22, after the Penn defense had again stalled a Cornell drive at the Quaker 5.

Deserting the middle and exploiting the corners, Marinaro picked up 101 yards in the second period, his longest was the 36-yard touchdown romp for the Big Red.

It came at 13:14, 3 minutes after Al Cook, the Quaker halfback, had romped 44 yards on a reverse to score, and it kept Cornell close at the half, when the score was 17-9 in favor of Penn.

Ron Dawson scored from the 2 for Penn at 4:54 of the third quarter, capping an 82-yard drive that took 11 plays.

However, Furbush got Cornell going on a 59-yard drive, scoring himself from the 1 at 8:36, and then making up for the Cornell missed kick in the first quarter by running for 2 points into the right corner.

With Penn ahead by 7 points, 24-17, Micir mixing his passing and his rushing game took the Quakers 80 yards downfield to score again, and the game seemed out of reach for the Big Red again with the Quakers ahead, 31-17, at the end of three quarters.
