

# UNDEFEATED PENN WINS IN OVERTIME

Beats Princeton, 66-62, for  
 No. 16 After Late Rally

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 28 —  
 Corky Calhoun gave the University of Pennsylvania an 11th-hour reprieve against Princeton tonight when he sank a 22-foot jump shot with two seconds left in regulation time, tying the score at 60-all.

The Quakers went on to beat the Tigers, 66-62, in overtime to remain undefeated following their closest call of the basketball campaign.

A tight defense, which held Penn to only six field goals in the second half, nearly enabled Princeton to engineer a major upset. Instead, the nation's fourth-ranked team, Penn, won its 16th game of the season before 4,854 persons in the Palestra.

The Quakers, who have won four Ivy League games, extended their league streak to 18 straight victories over two seasons. Penn is half a game ahead of Columbia in the league battle.

## Penn Whittles Lead

Princeton was on the verge of victory when the Tigers led, 56-49, with only two minutes remaining. Then the Quakers closed in with one field goal and seven foul shots before Calhoun made the clutch basket as time ran out.

Steve Bilsky one of Penn's fine guards, sat out much of the game with a thigh muscle injury he suffered in practice Monday. Dave Wohl, the other good guard, was benched in the first half when he drew his third personal foul.

But even at that, Princeton was not supposed to press Penn so hard. The Tigers had won only five of 13 games and one in the league. But the Tigers were tigers in the second half, and Brian Taylor, Princeton's best, was hard to stop as he stole the ball, drove in for shots and even bothered the taller Penn players while on defense.

Taylor finished with 21 points, 14 in the second half. But he fouled out in overtime.
