

# PENN RALLY TOPS BROWN, 70 TO 56

Quakers, Down by 5 at Half,  
Capture 19th in Row

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Feb. 12—  
Penn's basketball team withstood Brown's mini slowdown and three variations of zone defenses tonight to record its 19th consecutive victory, including seven in the Ivy League, 70-56.

For 30 minutes, the Brown defenses were successful in cutting off the Quaker outside shooting and causing numerous turnovers. During the last 10 minutes, Penn, led by Steve Bilsky, made a strong comeback.

Penn also ran its league victory streak to 21 games.

Penn trailed at half-time, 27-22, hitting on only 31 per cent of its field-goal attempts in the opening 20 minutes.

Bilsky, the 5-foot-10-inch floor general, was the first to break through the Brown zone, which at different times was 3-2, 2-3 and 2-1-2.

Held to 2 points in the first half, Bilsky, who missed the Princeton game and was used sparingly against Cornell and Columbia because of a pulled right thigh muscle, finished as the scoring leader with 23 points.

Bilsky, whose 2 points in the first half put him over the 1,000-point career scoring mark, hit on 5 straight points in 35 seconds at the start of the second half to tie the game at 27-all.

Almost 2½ minutes later, Bob Morse scored a foul shot and Penn had its first lead, 30-29. From there on, it was all downhill for the Bruins, whose season won-lost record fell to 9-9, including 4-3 in the Ivy League.

Brown, enjoying one of its better seasons, despite its record, has been drawing good crowds. Tonight's standing-room turnout of 2,957 was the largest since a Princeton team led by Bill Bradley played here in 1965.
