

Ivy Crown Clinched

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 27— Pennsylvania trounced Yale, 93-63, tonight to win the Ivy League title and a berth in the National Collegiate championship tournament.

St. Joseph's defeated La Salle, 66-56, in the second game of the double-header at the Palestra.

Undefeated Penn made its 24th victory this season one of its easiest. The Quakers led, 44-29, at the half, and later, when Yale's shooting went sour, the lead jumped to 75-41.

The defeat was Yale's 21st in 24 games.

Steve Bilsky was the high scorer for the winners with 16 points. This was Penn's last home game and Dick Harter, the coach, made a ceremony of the occasion. The five seniors, not all of whom are regulars, played as a unit toward the end, and then were withdrawn one at a time.

Ivy Record Is Set

Their departures brought a loud response from the cheering Penn students and no one drew a larger salute than Bilsky, the 5-foot-11-inch back-court ace.

Penn has two regular season games left—at Cornell and Columbia next weekend. The draw for the N.C.A.A. Eastern regional tournament comes up next week. Penn will draw one

of five opponents and some of their enthusiasts hope the first one is Fordham.

The Ivy championship was the Quakers' second in a row. They have won 26 straight Ivy League games, a record. Penn has in recent years become the dominant athletic force among the Ivies with the notable exception of the showcase sport, football.

Tonight Harter played all 14 of his men and 12 scored. After Bilsky the high men were Jim Haney, one of the seniors; Dave Wohl, a three-year starter, and Phil Hankinson, one of the brilliant sophomores on the squad.

Yale's captain, Jim Morgan, was high scorer for the out-classed Elis with 18 points.
