

# LAFAYETTE HALTS PENN TEAM, 17-15

Scores First Victory Over  
Quakers Since 1923

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 16 (AP) Lafayette utilized a solid ground game and voided turnovers today to upset Penn, 17-15, for its first victory over the Quakers since 1923.

Doug Elgin gained 145 yards on 37 carries to pace the Leopards' offense, while the Lafayette defense forced four fumbles and one interception while twice holding Penn on downs within 10 yards of the goal.

Bouncing back strongly from its 49-0 loss to Delaware last week, Lafayette jumped to a 17-0 half-time lead.

After Penn's Bob Hoffman fumbled on his 34 early in the first quarter, the Leopards scored in nine plays, the touchdown coming on a 2-yard scamper by Tim Grip.

When the next Lafayette drive stalled on the Penn 29, Chet Benash kicked a 45-yard field goal. Elgin scored the Leopards' final touchdown on a 6-yard dash near the beginning of the second quarter, closing a seven-play drive that started with recovery of another Hoffman fumble on the Penn 35.

Gary Shue played quarterback for Penn in place of injured Tom Pinto and finally untracked in the second half. A 20-yard pass from Shue to Pete Luciano set up a 1-yard touchdown plunge by Shue in the opening minutes of the half.

With 1:19 remaining in the game, Shue again combined with Luciano for an 8-yard touchdown pass and a 2-point conversion. An onside kick failed, however, and Lafayette ran out the clock.

The victory was the Leopards' fourth of the season against the defeat by Delaware. The triumph came against the very man who coached Lafayette a year ago, Harry Gamble, whose Quakers evened their won-lost record at 2-2.
