

PENN OVERPOWERS HARVARD, 84 TO 60

Remains in Tie for Ivy Lead
—Calhoun Stands Out

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 4
—Pennsylvania cashed in on eight of its first 11 field-goal attempts to build up a 16-2 advantage and then coasted to an 84-60 Ivy League victory over Harvard tonight. The Quakers now share the Ivy lead with Brown.

The Crimson never got any closer than 9 points, having trailed at half-time by 41-32. The Quakers hit for the first 5 points of the second half to settle the issue. Penn's stand-out, Corky Calhoun, helped the visitors win going away with 15 points in the last 20 minutes.

The victory gave Penn a 4-1 won-lost league record and a 13-2 mark overall. The disappointing Harvard quintet now has lost five straight Ivy games and is 7-9 on the season.
