

Penn Five Clinches Tie for Ivy Crown, Beating Yale, 86-65

NEW HAVEN, March 3—
Leading all the way, the Pennsylvania basketball team scored an 86-65 victory over Yale tonight and clinched at least a tie for the Ivy League title.

Phil Hankinson, a 6-foot-8-inch junior from Great Neck, L.I., led all the scorers with 27 points. He also led in rebounding with 12 as the Quakers posted their 12th victory in 13 Ivy League games. Penn maintains a one-game edge over Princeton which also won tonight.

There wasn't much point in rooting for the home team tonight so the 2,600 fans in Payne Whitney Gymnasium cheered mostly for the Ivy League leaders. Penn, no doubt, will represent the league for the third straight time in the opening round of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Eastern regionals next Saturday against Providence at St. John's University in Jamaica, Queens.

So there was a banner hanging from the balcony saying: "New Haven Welcomes Mighty Penn."

When Corky Calhoun, a 6-7 senior at Penn, scored his third basket of the second half, he reached the 1,000-point plateau. The game was stopped with 12:25 to play in order to give him the ball and he received a standing ovation from the fans. He finished with 21 points.

All that remains for the Quakers now is to beat Brown in their last league game tomorrow in Providence. Then it would not matter what Princeton does here tomorrow for

Penn would have clinched the league crown.

Calhoun, along with Bob Morse, who scored 16 points tonight, is part of a senior group that has won 40 of 41 Ivy League games in its college career with a 96-5 over-all won-lost record.

The Quakers extended their winning streak to 13 games. Yale lost its fifth in a row and slipped to a 7-16 won-lost record over all and 5-8 in league play.
