
Penn Tops Citadel, 67-34; La Salle Is 69-67 Victor

Penn Tops Citadel, 67-34; La Salle Is 69-67 Victor

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 6 (AP)
--Ninth-ranked Penn overcame
a stall and routed the Citadel
five, 67-34, tonight at the Palestra in the second game of a
basketball program.

In the opener Bobby Jones made a short jump shot to give La Salle a lead it never lost on the way to a scrambling 69-67 triumph over Biscayne of Florida. It was the Explorers' third straight.

The Southern Conference Citadel Bulldogs took only five shots the first half, made four and trailed, 29-9, at intermission because of nine turnovers.

Phil Hankinson and Ron Haigler led Penn with 18 points each as the Quakers won their second game against no defeats. The Citadel, 1-1, was topped by Steve Fishel with 8.

Oregon State wasted a 10point lead, but rallied behind the play of Charlie Neal to defeat Temple, 56-50, in the third
