

Penn State's 2d-Half Rally Sets Back Columbia, 61-52

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa., Jan. 10—Ron Brown scored 11 of his 13 points in the second half as Penn State rallied to beat Columbia, 61-52, tonight.

Randy Meister and Keenan Preston led Penn State with 14 points each and Mark Hardaway topped Columbia's scorers with 13.

Columbia held the Nittany Lions scoreless the last five minutes of the first half and scored 13 straight points to take a 25-24 half-time lead.

Jacksonville Wins, 73-71

GREENVILLE, S.C., Jan. 10 (AP)—Henry Williams sank two free throws with three seconds left and gave 15th-ranked Jacksonville a 73-71 victory tonight against Furman University.

Eddie Kelley's jumper from the key for Furman tied the game at 71-71 with 53 seconds left, then Roy Simpson stole the ball from Jacksonville. Furman played for one shot with Simpson, who had 21 points, shooting with eight seconds left.

The ball rolled off the rim and Williams drew a foul in the scramble for the ball. The sophomore's free throws gave Jacksonville its 11th victory in 13 starts.

Wagner Triumphs, 88-74

Wagner College opened a comfortable first-half lead last night and coasted to an 88-74 Middle Atlantic Conference victory over Elizabethtown at the winner's court. Tom Miller, with 22 points, and John Lumpis, with 21, paced the Seahawks to their third victory of the season.

N.C. State Defeats Duke

RALEIGH, N.C., Jan. 10 (AP) Fourth-ranked North Carolina State, despite a 31-point performance from Duke's Chris Redding, handed the Blue Devils a 94-78 Atlantic Coast Conference defeat tonight.

The Wolfpack rolled up its 10th triumph without a loss. N.C. State's scoring was led by 7-4 Tommy Burleson and 5-7 Monte Towe, each with 21 points.

North Carolina 92-58 Victor

CHAPEL HILL, N. C., Jan. 10 (AP)—North Carolina crushed Clemson, 92-58, tonight as the

seventh-ranked Tar Heels dominated their first Atlantic Coast Conference game of the season.

George Karl led North Carolina with 23 points. The Tigers' leading scorer, Van Gregg, was held to 3 points.
