

# St. John's Routs Clemson, 87-59

A strong second half carried St. John's to an 87-59 basketball victory over Clemson last night before 3,159 at Alumni Hall on the Redmen's Jamaica campus.

Leading by 29-28 after a sluggish first half, the winners moved out quickly after intermission and turned the game into a rout.

The rebounding of Ed Searcy and Tony Prince along with some accurate shooting by Bill Schaeffer, who finished with 21 points, was a major factor.
