

ST. JOHN'S SCORES OVER SETON HALL

Schaeffer Leads Redmen in 107-77 Victory—Fordham Beats Army, 77-68

SOUTH ORANGE, N. J., Jan. 24—St. John's took an early lead and rolled to a 107-77 basketball victory over Seton Hall tonight. It was the Redmen's 12th victory in 14 starts.

St. John's shot 59 per cent from the floor and outrebounded the Pirates 56-39. Bill Schaeffer scored 12 of 16 field goal attempts for 24 points. John Ramsay led Seton Hall with 18 points.

The losers shot 35 per cent from the floor.

Trailing 6-5, St. John's went ahead for good on field goals by Ed Searcy, Tony Prince and Schaeffer.
