

PENN FIVE ROUTS BROWN BY 88-60

Ivy Leaders Hold Bruins to No Field Goals for 7:39

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 3 (AP)—Penn held Brown without a field goal in the final 7 minutes 39 seconds of the first half tonight and coasted to an 88-60 victory in an Ivy League basketball game at the Palestra.

The victory kept the Quakers atop the league with a 5-1 won-lost record and ran their overall mark to 13-4.

Brown tied it, 23-23, on a jump shot by Lloyd Desvigne, but that was the Bruins' last goal of the half. Penn outscored Brown, 18-2, for the rest of the half.

Ron Haigler with 27 points and Phil Hankinson with 16 led the way. Phil Brown was high scorer for the losers with 17.

Harvard Tops Columbia, 64-59

Harvard survived a late Columbia rally that narrowed a 19-point lead to 4 and posted a 64-59 victory last night at University Gym. The Crimson advanced its Ivy League record to 3-2, while Columbia fell to 3-3.

Neither team displayed much offense in the first half, which ended with Harvard on top, 25-19. The visitors shot a poor 29 per cent from the field while the Lions were even worse at 19 per cent.

In the second half, the Crimson, sparked by a substitute guard, Jean Wilkinson, reeled off 16 straight points to assume a 47-28 lead with 10 minutes remaining. Bob Evans and John Byrnes paced the Lions' final flurry, which closed the margin to 60-56 with 1 minute remaining.
