

Princeton Tops Columbia, 82-54, and Remains Tied With Penn for Ivy Lead

MANAKAS TALLIES HIS 1,000TH POINT

Tiger Captain Scores 28 in Leading the Offense— Penn Drubs Cornell

PRINCETON, N.J., Feb. 10— Princeton remained in a tie with Penn for the Ivy League basketball lead tonight by running away from Columbia, 82-54, in Jadwin Gymnasium.

Toward the end, the only excitement for the 4,100 fans centered around Ted Manakas, the Princeton captain. He entered the game with a chance to become the 11th man in Princeton history to score 1,000 or more points in a varsity career. He just made it by scoring 28 points and leading the Tigers to their seventh victory in eight Ivy League games.

With 6½ minutes remaining in the game, the senior from Fort Lee, N.J., hit on one of his typical jump shots from the right side. That gave him 27 points and 999 for his college career.

About two minutes later Manakas took a fine pass from Jim Sullivan and was apparently certain to make a lay-up. But he was hacked by Bob Evans, Columbia's captain and the Ivy League's leading scorer, and missed the shot.

Manakas was awarded two free throws. He made the first for his 1,000th point. He missed the second and went to the bench shortly after that without scoring again.

Princeton had broken a fair zone defense by Columbia long before Manakas reached his milestone. The Lions, who gave the Tigers some early problems, just ran out of gas as the taller and quicker Princetonians drove through the middle of the zone for scores.

The game was tied at 11-all and 13-all, but was not really close again after the first nine minutes. By intermission, Princeton was 10 points in front and widening the margin.

Princeton, Penn in Tie

Princeton and Penn keep edging toward a final deadlock in the Ivy race. Such a regular-season finish would lead to a playoff, March 6, probably at St. John's Alumni Hall in Jamaica, Queens. The Quakers stayed even with Princeton at 7-1 tonight by beating Cornell.

Jack Rohan, Columbia's coach, said after his team lost to Penn last night and Princeton tonight, "People thought Penn had it all sewed up before the season started. I never felt that way and I still feel Princeton can beat Penn if they meet again. That doesn't mean I favor Princeton in such a game. It just means Princeton has as much chance as Penn in a playoff. And don't forget, there's Harvard."

Penn and Princeton play Cornell and Columbia again next weekend, Yale and Brown the following weekend and finish the regular season home against Dartmouth and Harvard. Princeton faces Harvard, March 3, the final day of the regular campaign, while Penn plays Dartmouth.

Rohan said: "Penn and Princeton play entirely different games. The reason we were closer to Penn last night [74-59] is that Princeton has the type of shooting we can't stop well."

The Big Green hit on 16 of 25 field goals in building up a 47-29 edge at half-time. Mike Baskauskas scored 18 points for Yale.
