

QUAKERS REMAIN TIED FOR IVY LEAGUE

Capture 6th Triumph in Row on Free-Throw Edge—Both Teams Shoot Poorly

The weather outside of Columbia's University Gym was cold and the shooting inside was colder but Penn still managed to defeat the Lions, 59-52 before a crowd of 1,426 last night.

The victory, Penn's sixth in a row and ninth in 10 Ivy League games, helped the Quakers retain their first-place tie with Princeton in the League race with four games to play. Princeton defeated last-place Cornell, 56-44, last night.

The leading scorers for Penn were Phil Hankinson, with 24 points, and Ron Haigler, with 18, but Haigler managed to hit only four of 17 shots from the floor, although he made up for it somewhat with his 15 rebounds, a game high.

It was the second disappointing league defeat in a row for Columbia, which lost a 51-50 decision to Princeton on Friday night on the second of two free throws by John Berger after time had expired. The Lions now have a 5-16 won-lost record overall and have lost 7 of 10 Ivy games.

Bob Evans, Columbia's leading scorer with a 19.2-point average led the Lions with 14 points. He took only three shots in the first half, making two of them.

The Lions outscored the Quakers from the floor but hit on only 26 of 68 shots for a 27.2 percentage while Penn hit 21 of 49 attempts for a 47.6 percentage. $\frac{1}{4}$ $\frac{1}{4}$

At the free-throw line, Columbia was 0 for 6, all in the first half, while Penn hit 17 of 19.

Because of the poor shooting by both teams, the game was close until the last six minutes.

Trailing by only 9 at the half, Columbia had its hottest streak of the night, hitting on 13 of 22 shots from the floor to pull within 3 points of the Quakers, 49-46, with 6:6 to play, but then they called time out with five minutes left and got cold.

When they had returned from their huddle, the Lions missed their next seven shots while Penn was slowly opening their lead to 9 points at 55-46 with the use of their 2-3 zone on defense and deliberate play on offense running out the clock.

The key men in the Lions' early second-half rally were Brian McAuliffe and Evans, who had 10 points apiece on 5 of 8 performances from the floor.

ITHACA, N. Y., Feb. 17—Princeton took advantage of an ineffective Cornell team in the first half tonight, then fought off a mild rally and defeated the Big Red, 56-44. It was Cornell's 14th straight loss.

The Tigers' Ivy League won-lost record is 9-1 and 14-7 overall. Cornell is 0-10 in the league and 3-19 for the season.

Cornell pulled within 7 points late in the game on the shooting of Max Jones and Jim Willmot, but Princeton controlled the play for the rest of the game.

The victory, which ended a six-game losing streak for the Elis against Harvard, raised the Yale's Ivy mark to 5-5 and its over-all record to 8-13. Harvard, 6-4 in Ivy competition, is now 13-9 over all.

Tim Kearns, a junior guard, hit a career high of 36 points and Jim Cartmell chipped in with 18 rebounds to pace the Elis.
