

PENN STATE GAINS WRESTLING TITLE

Getty's Consolation Victory Clinches Team Honors

PITTSBURGH, Feb. 24 (AP) —A victory by Charlie Getty in the last match of the semifinal consolation round clinched the team title today for Penn State at the Eastern Collegiate Wrestling Association tournament.

The 6-foot-4-inch 260-pound Getty, pinned earlier in the day by Tim Karpoff of Yale in a regular semifinal match, outpointed Bob Morton of Rutgers, 8-1, to move into the consolation final and give Penn State the title.

The Nittany Lions, who sent six wrestlers into tonight's finals in the 10 classes, had captured 103 points in the team standing of the 16-team tournament. Navy, the defending champion, was second with 78½, followed by Lehigh, 68½; Pitt, 66; Army, 47, and the University of Pennsylvania, 43.

Getty, a starting tackle on the Penn State football team, was pinned by Karpoff at 6:35 of their match. Karpoff and George Baranic of Lehigh were to meet for the heavyweight title.

Baranic outpointed top-seeded Karl Chandler of Princeton, 10-3, in the semifinals. Chandler suffered a broken ankle late in the match.
