

17,463 See Notre Dame Defeat Indiana

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Dec. 11 (AP) — John Shumate scored 26 points for Notre Dame as the sixth-ranked Fighting Irish beat Indiana, ranked third, 73-67, tonight before 17,463 fans, the largest crowd to attend a basketball game in Indiana.

Shumate scored the first basket of the game and the Irish never trailed. Notre Dame, with a 5-0 won-lost mark, led by as many as 11 points several times in the first half. The margin reached 14 points, 60-46, in the second half.

The Hoosiers pulled within 3 points late in the game.

It was Indiana's first loss in four outings this season and only the second loss at home since the opening of the Assembly Hall two years ago.

The crowd broke the previous record of 17,436 set against Purdue last year.

Indiana was led by a junior forward, Steve Green, who got 13 of his 21 points in the second half.
