## Penn State Rally Tops Fordham Five, 73 to 67

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 26 (AP)—Ron Brown scored 4 of his 13 points in overtime as Penn State rallied for a 73-67 victory over Fordham tonight in the opener of the 13th annual Quaker City basketball tournament.

Carl Meier's free throw with two seconds to play gave California a 64-63 upset victory over Pennsylvania in the second game.

Penn State, with a 5-4 won-lost record, jumped to an 11-point lead with 1 minute 8 seconds left in the half. But Stan Frankoski, a Fordham freshman, and Darryl Brown combined for 6 points to close within 36-29 at half-time.

The Rams, now 4-4, outscored the Nittany Lions 16-2 at the outset of the second half on the shooting of Frankoski, who tallied 6 points, and took a 50-41 lead with 12:50 remaining.

Frankoski topped all scorers with 23 points. Jim Ouderkirk and Randy Meister, a 6-foot-9-inch junior, led Penn State with 18 points apiece.

### Duke Rallies to Win

Chris Redding led the winners with 23 points and Johnny Britt was high for the Hill-toppers with 18.

### Colorado, Missouri Gain

KANSAS CITY, Dec. 26 (UPI)—Pat Kelly sank three free throws in the final 1 minute 46 seconds tonight and Scott Wedman scored 30 points in leading Colorado to a 73-71 victory over Kansas and allowing the Buffaloes to join Missouri in the semi-finals of the Big Eight basketball tournament.

Steve Dengos and Al Eberhard combined for 45 points to lead Missouri to a 73-70 upset victory over 14th-ranked Oklahoma in the other first-round game.

### Rutgers Wins, 73-67

OKLAHOMA CITY, Dec. 26 (AP)—Ron Sellers hit two free throws tonight to give Rutgers a 6-point lead, and the Scarlet Knights used the stall to perfection to gain a 73-67 victory over Oklahoma City University in the 38th All-College basketball tournament.

Bob Trowbridge paced Southern California to a 98-76 victory over Southwestern University of Georgetown, Tex., in the opening game of the tournament.
