PRINCETON, N. J., Jan 5-John Beecroft and Ron Haigler each scored 17 points today as Pennsylvania opened its drive for a fifth consecutive Ivy League championship with a 69-59 victory over Princeton in the Ivy opener for both schools in Jadwin Gymnasium.

Leading, 33-29, early in the second half, the Quakers took with а spurt, raising their advantage to 49-31 with 11 minutes left in the game. A scrappy Tiger rally reduced the margin to 8 points, but Penn sealed the triumph by tallying its last 14 points from the foul line.

Andy Rimol, a senior center, paced Princeton with 14 points as the Tigers lost for the sixth time in 11 games. Penn raised its won-lost record to 5 and 3.

Brown Beats Columbia

Brown defeated Columbia, 81-62, at University Gym last night, outrebounding the Lions, 39-26, en route to its third Ivy victory against one loss. Led by Phil Brown's 19 points and 15 rebounds and Vaughn Clarke's 15 points, Brown padded a 6-point halftime lead with a 20-9 burst

midway through the final half.

John Avery and Mark Hardaway paced the Lions with 14 and 12 points, respectively. The defeat was Columbia's eighth straight since an opening victory over City College.
