

Columbia Edged by Cornell Five

ITHACA, N. Y., Jan. 11—Dwight Kiel's 15-foot jump shot with two seconds to play gave Cornell a 64-63 Ivy League basketball victory over Columbia tonight. For Kiel, a sophomore guard, it was his only shot of the game.

The victory broke a six-game losing streak for Cornell, with a 2-7 won-lost record, and was its first in three Ivy games. Columbia has lost nine straight after an opening triumph over City College and is 0-3 in the league.
