

Bellizeare Star as Penn Wins, 28-18

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 27 —Penn opened its 98th football season with a 28-18 victory over Lehigh tonight before 17,885 at Franklin Field.

Adolph Bellizeare, the fleet 5-foot-9-inch senior halfback from Roxbury, Mass., scored three Penn touchdowns, one on a 74-yard run early in the third period that broke up a close game. He left the field late in the third quarter with a charleyhorse in the left calf after returning a 59-yard punt by Mark Weaver for 31 yards. Bellizeare gained a total of 227 yards.
