

Penn Beats Lafayette In 37-7 Rout

EASTON, Pa., Oct. 19—Pennsylvania's quarterback, Marty Vaughn, passed for four touchdowns, a school record, as his team rolled over Lafayette College today, 37-7.

The record he tied was his own, set against Columbia in 1973.

Vaughn hit 11 of 18 passes for 188 yards; two of his scoring tosses went to Bucky Bucola. Vaughn also set a new Penn career record for touchdown passes with 24.

Penn's Adolph Bellizeare, the nation's leading punt returner (28.3 yards per return) and all-purpose runner (178.7 yards per game), rushed for 65 yards in 12 attempts and made two returns for 48 yards.

Lafayette scored the first points of the game with 43 seconds left in the first period as Dean Golwes slammed over from the 1-yard line. Dan Kuhn made the conversion.

The scoring drive had begun on the Pennsylvania 30 when Jim Guill, a defensive end, recovered a fumble by Bellizeare.

Pennsylvania didn't waste much time getting back on the scoreboard at 14:22 of the second quarter, as Bellizeare plunged over from the 1. The score was set up by an interference call, which gave Penn a first and goal on the 1.

After the kickoff, Rich Vaccari recovered a Lafayette fumble on the Penn 45 and Vaughn directed his club down to the Leopard 11, where Tim Martin kicked a 28-yard field goal to give Penn the lead for good at 10-7.
