

Penn Pins 103-81 Loss On Harvard

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 15 (AP) — Penn, led by its big front three of Henry Johnson, Ron Haigler and Bob Bigelow, pulled away with a 65-point second half tonight and defeated Harvard, 103-81 in an Ivy League basketball game.

Harvard was all even 34-34 late in the first half. Then the Quakers hit for 4 points before the intermission and another quick 6 at the start of the second half to take complete command.

Johnson scored 23 points and had 11 rebounds. Haigler had 21 points and Bigelow 18 as Penn increased its record to 18-4, including 9-1 in the Ivy League. Harvard is 7-13 overall and 4-5 in the league.

Brown Downs Columbia

Phil Brown scored 22 points and pulled down 19 rebounds last night in sparking Brown University to a 91-77 conquest of Columbia at Levine Gym. It was the Bruins eighth victory in 10 games.

Brown, who played his high school basketball at Horace Mann in New York, with 19 rebounds was the key factor in the visitors' 47-39 edge off the boards. The Bruins' 6-foot-5 forward sparked a 16-7 burst at the start of the second half that broke open what had been a close game.

The Bruins, are 8-2 in the Ivy League, in a tie with Princeton for second place.

Penn State Routs Army

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Feb. 15 (AP) — Kevin Cadle, a sophomore guard making his first start of the season, scored 20 points today to lead Penn State to an easy 81-64 victory over Army.

The Nittany Lions, with an 8-10 won-lost record built their lead gradually in the first half when Cadle scored 12 points.
