

Rutgers, Trailing by 15, Rallies to Beat LaSalle, 96-82

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 22 (AP) — Rutgers used sensational second-half shooting to rally from far behind and defeat LaSalle, 96-82, in basketball at the Palestra tonight.

In the second game of the double-header, Villanova defeated St. Joseph, 71-67.

Rutgers, which was behind, 54-39, two minutes into the second half, made 24 of its first 31 shots in the half, scored 16 straight points at one stage and went on to its 18 victory in 24 games.

The rally was paced by Ed Dabney, who was the game's high scorer with 31 points, and Hollis Copeland, a freshman, who scored 19. Phil Sellers added 25 points.

St. John's Routs Iona

St. John's, led by Glen Williams, Mel Utley and Kevin Cluess, overpowered Iona, 73-47, last night to hand the Gaels their 14th straight loss.

Williams scored 12 points, Utley 11 and Cluess 10 as the Redmen piled up a 33-15 halftime lead on their own court and used reserves most of the second half. The Redmen led, 66-30, with 7:30 remaining. All 12 St. John's players scored. Kevin Bass of Iona led all scorers with 18 points. St. John's now has a 16-7 record; Iona is 4-18.
