

Lehigh's Late Rally Subdues Penn, 34-23

BETHLEHEM, Pa., Sept. 27—Lehigh scored three touchdowns the fourth quarter today and defeated Pennsylvania in football, 34-23.

Penn, making its seasonal debut, took a 23-13 lead into the final period seeking its 35th straight victory over the Engineers. It was Lehigh's second triumph of the season against one loss.

Lehigh, which handicapped itself most of the game with an assortment of penalties and turnovers, outscored the Quakers 21-0 and ended one of the most frustrating strings of defeats in college football.

Much of the game was a field goal kicking contest. Weaver connected on 31 and 47 yard efforts, the second tying a Lehigh record for distance. Tim Mazzetti scored for Penn on kicks covering 28, 37 and 42 yards.

Penn, although unable to do much on its own, played an opportune game and turned Lehigh mistakes into points.

The touchdown that put Lehigh ahead came on a 43-yard drive, capped by Joe Sterrett's 11-yard pass to Mark Weaver. That score with the conversion gave Lehigh a 27-23 advantage. Earlier in the period the Engineers had moved 64 yards in 10 plays for their second touchdown which came on a 9-yard run by Weaver.

Brown 41, Rhode Island 20

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Sept. 27—Bob Bateman, a quarterback, and Bob McNamara, a fullback, each ran for two touchdowns today as Brown defeated Rhode Island, 41-20.

Bateman, who directed the Brown attack until late in the game, completed 12 of 20 passes for 188 yards. He had two passes intercepted.

Rhode Island scored first, after 10 minutes of play, when Rich Moser went over from one yard. Brown took control then. McNamara scored twice, each time on 1-yard runs. The first quarter scoring was sandwiched between a total of seven fumbles, four by the Rams, three of which Brown recovered.

Jose Violante's first of two field goals, a 22-yarder, gave the Bruins a 17-7 half-time lead.

The Bruins scored again on their first possession in the third quarter on Bateman's 1-yard run, and appeared to be in complete control.
