PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 17—

Tim Mazzetti of Penn equaled his school record, kicking a 42-yard field goal with 52 seconds left, as the Quakers defeated Lafayette, 13-0, tonight on water-logged Franklin Field.

Mazzetti also kicked a 21-yard field goal at 11 minutes 28 seconds of the fourth quarter to put Penn ahead, 10-0.

Despite bad playing conditions caused by gusty, driving rain on the Astro-Turf field, John Wixted carried the ball 30 times for 121 yards to become Penn's third-highest career rusher with 1,571 yards.
