

# Fordham Defeats Yale; Bucknell Upsets Penn

NEW HAVEN, Dec. 3 — Kevin Brown made a layup with 5 seconds to play tonight, giving Fordham's basketball team a 47-45 victory over Yale.

Yale, now with a 1-1 won-lost record, gained a 45-45 tie with 1 minute 25 seconds left on a layup by Carnell Cooper, who led the Elis with 17 points. Rich Dunphy paced Fordham, now 2-0, with 14 points.

## Bucknell 66, Penn 64

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 3 (AP) — Steve Oristaglio put Bucknell ahead with a steal and a layup with three minutes left and the Bisons held on to upset Penn, 66-64, tonight in the opening game for both teams. Kevin McDonald of Penn, last season's Ivy League champions, missed a 15-foot jumper with 2 seconds left that would have tied the game.

## Princeton 60, Navy 59

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Dec. 3 (AP) — Mickey Steuerer converted both free shots in a one-and-one situation with 4 seconds left tonight as Princeton, last season's National Invitation Tournament champion, overcame a rare Navy zone defense for a 60-59 victory. Navy, now 1-2, held a 17-point lead in the first half and a 38-33 half-time lead. Princeton is 2-0.

## Illinois St. 100, L.I.U. 78

Roger Powell scored a game-high 24 points to lead Illinois State to a 10-78 victory over Long Island University last night at the loser's court in Brooklyn.

## St. Peter's 70, Stonehill 69

free throws with 7 seconds remaining and gave St. Peter's College a 70-69 victory over Stonehill tonight. St. Peter's had blown a 16-point lead in the second half when it was outscored, 28-6, over 9½ minutes. The visitors held a 69-68 edge when they lost possession on a backcourt violation 3 seconds before Richardson's winning points.

## Norfolk State 100, Hunter 50

Hunter College suffered its worst loss in its eight-year history of varsity basketball, 100-50, to Norfolk State College tonight. Bert Lindsay scored 26 points, more than half the Hawks' total.

## Massachusetts 99, Harvard 87

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Dec. 3 (AP) — Mike Pyatt scored 17 points in the first half and Mike Stokes 20 in the second and paced Massachusetts to a 99-87 victory over Harvard tonight. It was the Minutemen's third straight victory and Harvard's third straight defeat this season.

## Hofstra 79, St. Francis 76
