

# Princeton Stops Harvard, 62-57

**CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Jan. 9**—Harvard's comeback fell short tonight as Armond Hill of Princeton hit two foul shots in the closing seconds to preserve the Tigers' 62-57 Ivy League victory.

Harvard trailed by as many as 18 points in the first half. A Princeton forward, Barnes Hauptfuhrer, had 10 points.

Brian Banks, the Harvard center, had 20 points, Hauptfuhrer and Hill paced Princeton with 14 each.

Princeton is now 8-3 overall, and Harvard, 3-9.

## UConn 98, Columbia 69

**STORRS, Conn., Jan. 9 (AP)**—Tony Hanson scored 22 points and John Thomas collected 18 rebounds tonight as the University of Connecticut defeated Columbia, 98-69, in a Connecticut Classic semifinal.

The victory moved the Huskies into the tomorrow final against American University, which defeated Stetson, 49-45, tonight.

## Penn 71, Dartmouth 64

**HANOVER, N. H., Jan. 9 (AP)**—Penn built a 15-point lead in the second half and then staved off a Dartmouth rally, scoring a 71-64 victory tonight. The Quakers led, 56-41, with 7:27 to go. But Adam Sutton and John Lisowski rolled up 9 straight points for the Green to cut the Quaker lead to 62-60.

Keven McDonald scored 4 points and Bill Jones connected on a 3-point play in the closing minutes to secure the Penn victory.

## Yale 52, Brown 45

## Seton Hall 79, Hawaii 75

**SOUTH ORANGE, N. J., Jan. 9**—Glenn Mosely scored 31 points and had 18 rebounds as Seton Hall posted a 79-75 victory over Hawaii tonight. It was the third straight victory for the Pirates, now 7-6.

The Hall led, 43-36, at half-time, but the Rainbows came back. After four ties, the last at 73-73, Mark Coleman of Seton Hall connected on a jump shot and Tom Flaherty dropped in two free throws.

Mosely's 31 points were a career high. Reggie Carter led Hawaii with 22 points.
