

Princeton Subdues Brown Five, 56-47

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Feb. 13 — Princeton, the Ivy League's leader, posted a 56-47 victory over Brown tonight. The Tigers broke open a tight game with spurts of 11-4 and 10-4 in the second half and won going away.

Armond Hill led the winners with 18 points as Princeton raised its league won-lost record to 7-0 and overall mark to 15-4.

Princeton had a 22-14 lead with 8 minutes 3 seconds left in the first half, but the Bruins scored the next 6 points and pulled within 2 at 22-20. Princeton scored on a jump shot by Mickey Steuerer, and Brown got a foul shot that accounted for a 24-21 halftime score, Princeton ahead.

The Bruins scored the first two baskets of the second half and took their last lead of the night at 25-24 with 18:58 to go. The Tigers then scored the next 6 points, took a 30-25 lead and used an aggressive defense that held Brown to four field goals in the next 15 minutes. Princeton had a comfortable 52-39 lead before the Bruins made a late surge that closed the final score.

Columbia 75, Harvard 67

Columbia shut off Harvard's inside game and scored a 75-67 Ivy League victory last night. The victory gave Columbia a 4-3 league record.

Brian Banks and Bill Carey, two Harvard forwards who had been averaging over 31 points per game, were held to a total of 15. Forced to shoot from the outside, the Crimson were able to hit only 38.3 percent from the floor. The Lions, meanwhile, were hitting half of their 58 field-goal attempts while outrebounding Harvard, 42-26. Jeff Combs hit 18 points, Larry Collins, 16 for Columbia.

Dartmouth 60, Cornell 58

ITHACA, N. Y., Feb. 13 — Larry Cubas hit an eight-foot jumpshot with seven seconds to play that gave Dartmouth a 60-58 Ivy League victory over Cornell tonight.

Cubas had hit the tying basket with 35 seconds left and was the visitors' high scorer with 23 points. Cornell

had rallied from a 53-43 deficit with 8:31 remaining and built a 58-56 advantage with 44 seconds to play, on Stan Brown's layup.

The victory was Dartmouth's seventh straight and gave it a 13-5 record over all, 4-2 in the league. Cornell is 5-14 and 1-6.
