Princeton Beats Harvard, 69-48

PRINCETON, N.J., Feb. 21 —Despite a faltering performance in the first half, Princeton posted its 18th straight Ivy League basketball victory tonight, 69-48, over Harvard in Jadwin Gymnasium.

The victory lifted the Tigers' won-lost record to 18-4 over all and 10-0 in the Ivy League as they took one more step toward a title that has eluded them since 1969.

Harvard, which lost to Penn, 80-75, last night, took an 8-0 lead in the opening minutes on baskets by Muli Hannemann and Jonas Honnick.

But sparked by Armond Hill, who scored 17 of his game-high 21 points in the first half, the Tigers began to hit the mark and moved to their first lead, 13-12, at 11 minutes 46 seconds.

After the lead changed several times, Princeton went ahead to stay on a jumper by Hill and increased the margin to 27-20 at halftime.

The Tigers' doldrums, during which they shot only 34 percent from the floor during the first half, ended as Barnes Hauptfuhrer opened the second half with two straight baskets. He became the 12th Princeton player to hit the 1,000-point career mark. Hauptfuhrer ended with 14 points.

With Hauptfuhrer leading the way, the Tigers outscored the Crimson, 16-4, in the next 5 minutes to seal the victory.

Brian Banks, a junior center from Chicago, was high man for Harvard with 15 points and 8 rebounds. Harvard is now 6-15 over all and 1-8 in the Ivy League.

Penn 88, Dartmouth 66

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 21 (AP)—John Engles and Kevin McDonald tore Dartmouth's defense apart with their inside work in the second half as Penn scored an 88-66 Ivy League victory tonight in the Palestra.

In the second game of the doubleheader, Villanova, led by the Herron brothers, Larry and Keith, who scored a total of 32 points, defeated Temple, 59-58.

McDonald, the game's top scorer with 27 points, broke open the contest after Dartmouth, 13-8, reduced an 11-point deficit late in the first half to 56-51 with 11 min-

utes left. The 6-6 sophomore scored 12 points in the next 5 minutes as the Quakers sprinted to a 72-57 lead. It was Penn's eighth Ivy victory in 10 games.

F.D.U. 59, No. Carolina A. & T. 52

RUTHERFORD, N. J., Feb. 21 —Fairleigh Dickinson ended a four-game losing streak with a 59-52 victory over North Carolina A. and T. tonight. Scott Edmonds contributed 12 points and 13 rebounds for F.D.U., which is now 8-11. James Sparrow, a 6-6 sophomore guard from Brooklyn, led the losers with 21 points. North Carolina A. and T. is 17-5.

Cornell 67, Brown 63

W. Michigan 91, N. Illinois 74

Detroit 109, St. Francis 65

DETROIT, Feb. 21 (AP)—Terry Duerod and Terry Tyler had 21 points each tonight as the University of Detroit defeated St. Francis of Brooklyn, 109-65. Jerome Williams led St. Francis with 20 points.

Hartwick 52, Hunter 49

Hartwick, the No. 1 college-division team in New York State, overcame Hunter 52-49, last night, at the losers' gym. Hartwick is now 19-3 and Hunter, 12-13.

Columbia 76, Yale 75

Elmer Love, Larry Collins and Mike Wilhite each scored 4 overtime points, as Columbia outlasted Yale, 76-75, in an Ivy League game last night at Levian Gymnasium. Love, who earlier had lost

the ball out of bounds and helped force the game into overtime, blocked a shot and added an important rebound in the extra period.

With the score tied, 62-62, in regulation time, Columbia gained the lead on Love's tap-in. Yale came right back, as Jim McGuire connected on a baseline jumper. Collins again put Columbia in front, and after another Yale basket, Love gave Columbia the lead to stay at 70-68 with about 2 minutes remaining.

Tennessee 105, Ole Miss 81

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., Feb. 21 (AP)—Tennessee caught Mississippi in a four-minute scoring lull and jumped to a commanding lead to coast to a 105-81 Southeastern Conference victory tonight. Ernie Grunfeld and Bernard King scored 30 points each to lead Tennessee.

N. Carolina 73, Virginia 71

CHAPEL HILL, N. C., Feb. 21 (AP)—Mitch Kupchak's tap-in with a second left gave third-ranked North Carolina a 73-71 victory over Virginia tonight. The Tar Heels are 22-2 and Virginia is 14-10.
