

Unbeaten Rutgers Gains 24th Victory

WILLIAMSBURG, Va., Feb. 25 (UPI) — Mike Dabney scored a career-high 33 points tonight as fourth-ranked Rutgers held off a scrappy William and Mary basketball team and posted a 100-90 victory, the 24th for the undefeated Scarlet Knights.

William and Mary, after trailing by 50-41 at the half, slowed Rutgers' running game and drew within 4 points at 80-76 with 7 minutes 48 seconds remaining. But the Indians faltered and slipped to a 14-13 won-lost mark.

Phil Sellers chipped in 22 points for Rutgers. Ron Satterthwaite led William and Mary with 23 and John Lowenhaupt added 17.

Maryland led, 55-36, at half-time, and its coach, Lefty Driesell, began experimenting with his lineup early in the second half in preparation for next week's A.C.C. tournament. The Maryland all-American, John Lucas, had 22 points in the first half and only 2 afterward.
