

Penn Puts Lafayette to Rout, 42-7

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 14 (UPI)—Tom Roland hit a split end, Nelson Johnson, with a 26-yard touchdown pass in the second period, and Bob Nix returned an interception 22 yards for a score 15 seconds later, leading the University of Pennsylvania football team to a 42-7 rout of Lafayette tonight.

The Quakers, who led by 7-0 after the first quarter on a 1-yard run by John Montesanti, scored 21 points in the second period to break open the game, played in steady rain and stiff wind.

Roland, a junior quarterback, opened the second-quarter scoring with a 1-yard touchdown run.

The Leopards later fumbled away a punt, and Roland hit Johnson on the next play, from the Lafayette 26.

Nix, a linebacker, intercepted a pass by Rob Stewart on Lafayette's next play from scrimmage. He returned the ball 22 yards to give the Quakers a 28-0 halftime lead.

Phil Avila, a halfback, scored both Penn touchdowns in the final quarter, on runs of 1 and 75 yards.
