# Penn Five Is Triumphant Over Princeton by 78-63

PRINCETON, N.J., Jan. 3—Princeton and Penn, two teams who have won or shared the Ivy League championship 14 times in the last 15 years, opened their Ivy seasons against each other tonight in Jadwin Gymnasium.

The Quakers prevailed, 78-63, in a mistake-filled game, and late in the second half the Penn cheering section began a chant of, "We're No. 1 in the

Ivy League."

The Princeton coach, Pete Carril, said after the game, "This was one of the worst lickings we've ever taken from Penn, at least since I've been here."

It was the first time a Princeton team has given up more than 72 points since January 1975 when the Tigers lost to Duke, 90-73.

Penn shot 66 percent from the field in the second half, hitting on 20 of 30 shots. Kevin McDonald, a 6-foot-6inch Penn senior, led all scorers with 23 points.

There were 43 turnovers in the game,

including 26 by Princeton.

Penn led at halftime by 27-26. Penn then outscored Princeton by 12-2 early in the second half to take a 47-36 lead with 12 minutes left in the game.

#### Oral Roberts 66, Columbia 60

TULSA, Okla., Jan. 3—Oral Roberts University, paced by Lamont Reid's game-high 20 points, defeated Colum-

bia University, 66-60, tonight.

Reid, a 6-4, 190-pound junior who has scored 93 points in his last three games, connected on a driving layup with 6:23 to play and put the Titans on top for good, 55-54.

Oral Roberts evened its record at

6-6, while Columbia, loser of seven straight, fell to 2-7. The Lions were paced by Ricky Free with 17 points and Juan Mitchell with 15.

#### Syracuse 94, N. Texas State 84

SYRACUSE, Jan. 3 (AP) — Dale Shackleford scored 23 points, and Louis Orr scored 18 and had 12 rebounds to lead Syracuse past North Texas State, 94-84, tonight.

Syracuse improved its record to 11-1. Charles McMillian scored 29 points and Mal Davis scored 26 for North Texas

State, now 7-4.

Syracuse opened the game by scoring 8 consecutive points, and the Orangemen led by 17 points at halftime.

## UConn 76, Colgate 57

STORRS, Conn., Jan. 3 (AP)—The University of Connecticut, led by Jeff Carr who scored 18 points, defeated

Colgate, 76-57, tonight.

UConn, which had four players score 10 or more points, opened its biggest lead of the game, 46-26, early in the second half. UConn improved its record to 5-4 while Colgate dropped to 2-10.

#### Fairfield 88, Canisius 69

BUFFALO, Jan. 3 (AP)—Flip Williams hit 9 of 11 shots from the field and scored 20 points to pace Fairfield to an 88-69 victory over Canisius to-night

night.

Joe DeSantis and Kim Fisher scored 21 each as Fairfield won its fourth straight game and improved its record to 7-1. Canisius, led by Ron Peaks's 15 points, dropped its sixth straight game and its record fell to 2-8.

#### Utah State 79, Fairleigh 44

LOGAN, Utah, Jan. 3 (AP)—Utah State starters played nearly half the game in trouncing Fairleigh Dickinson tonight, 79-44.

After they had run up a 23-6 lead with 8:40 left in the first half, the Utah State starters were replaced by the sec-

ond team.

Coach Dutch Belnap pulled the first team again with 12:29 left in the second half.

### Georgetown 107, N.C. Central 51

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (UPI)— Ed Hopkins scored 29 points tonight to lead Georgetown to a 107-51 triumph over North Carolina Central.

It was the seventh straight victory for Georgetown and lifted the Hoyas' record to 9-2. Georgetown shot 59 percent from the field for the game.

#### Harvard 83, Northeastern 80

BOSTON, Jan. 3 (AP)—Cyrus Booker scored 23 points to help Harvard defeat Northeastern, 83-80, tonight.

Northeastern outrebounded Harvard, 46-24, and had the high scorer of the game, Dave Caligaris, who had 28 points. Harvard was left with a record for the season and Northeastern was 4-5.
