

Ohio State Upsets Illinois in Overtime

CHAMPAIGN, Ill., Jan. 13 (AP) — Herb Williams scored 29 points and Jim Smith hit a free throw in overtime to give Ohio State a 69-66 victory today over previously unbeaten Illinois in a Big Ten game. As a result, Ohio State moved to first place in the conference.

Carter Scott scored a field goal with 42 seconds remaining in regulation time for Ohio, tying the score, 60-60. Todd Penn then won a jump ball from Rob Judson of Illinois with 19 seconds to go. Ohio State missed a shot and with five seconds left in regulation time, Judson fired a 25-footer that missed, sending the game into overtime.

Kelvin Ramsey of Ohio State hit a field goal at 4:21 of the overtime period to put Ohio State ahead to stay, 62-60. Illinois did not score in the overtime period until 27 seconds remained.

During the second period Williams picked off an Illinois pass and Ramsey scored to put Ohio State ahead, 52-51, for the first time since midway through the first half.

However, Ramsey and Williams missed four free throws in a row, and Mark Smith put Illinois back in front, 55-54, with 5:57 to go in regulation time.

Smith was Illinois' leading scorer with 28 points.

The victory gave Ohio State an overall season won-lost record of 9-4, and a 4-0 mark in the Big Ten.

Illinois fell to 15-1 and 3-1 in the conference.

Virginia 69, N.C. State 62

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va., Jan. 13 (AP) — Jeff Lamp scored 25 points, including four free throws in the last 32 seconds, as Virginia's Cavaliers rallied for a 69-62 Atlantic Coast Conference upset today over North Carolina State's eighth-ranked Wolfpack.

The Cavaliers, 8-4 over all and 2-1 in the A.C.C., never were ahead until Lee Raker, who had 17 points, hit a jump shot from the right corner with 5:50 remaining to make it 50-48.

Wisconsin 77, Michigan 66

MADISON, Wis., Jan. 13 (UPI) — Wisconsin wiped out a 12-point deficit today by scoring 21 consecutive points early in the second half and went on to upset Michigan, 77-66, in a Big Ten game.

The victory gave the Badgers a 2-2 Big Ten record and an 8-5 mark over all. Michigan dropped to 1-3 in the conference and 7-5 over all.

Syracuse 74, UConn 60

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 13 (AP) — Roosevelt Bouie scored 21 points to lead Syracuse to a 74-60 victory over Connecticut tonight.

Bouie, with rebounding help from Louis Orr, sparked a second-half surge that helped Syracuse extend its winning streak to six and raise its record to 12-2.

Louisville 99, Maryland 84

COLLEGE PARK, Md., Jan. 13 (AP) — Darrell Griffith scored 14 of his game-high 30 points during a six-minute span and led Louisville to a 99-84 victory over Maryland tonight.

The Cardinals (12-3) took a 49-40 half-time lead with a 9-2 spurt in the final 1:35, and then opened a 20-point lead after only 4½ minutes of the second half.

Virginia Tech 83, Penn State 68

BLACKSBURG, Va., Jan. 13 (AP) — Dexter Reid and Les Henson started a 9-point run during the last three minutes of the first half tonight that sent Virginia Tech on its way to an 83-68 victory over Penn State.

Temple 72, Lafayette 51

EASTON, Pa., Jan. 13 (UPI) — Ricky Reed scored a game-high 24 points today to lead Temple to victory over Lafayette, 72-51, and lift the Owls' won-lost record to 12-1.

Temple had opened a 20-11 lead midway through the first half, but Lafayette fought back to tie the game, 30-30, at the intermission.

Queens 88, Hunter 82

Queens College defeated Hunter College, 88-82, in a City University Conference game last night at Queens. The Knights trailed by 6 points early in the game, 8-2, but led at halftime, 47-40.

Early in the second half, Hunter took the play away from the Knights and led by 1 point with 12:42 remaining. The Knights regained their composure and took the lead.

L.S.U. 80, Florida 72

BATON ROUGE, Jan. 13 (AP) — Jordy Hultberg scored 18 points and DeWayne Scales 28 tonight to rally Louisiana State to a 80-72 Southeastern Conference victory over Florida.

L.S.U., 11-2, and Florida fought on even terms for most of the game. The game was tied 17 times before L.S.U. decided to freeze the ball with 5:14 left and a 2-point lead. Ethan Martin drove for a basket to stretch L.S.U.'s margin to 4 with 1:07 to play.

Pennsylvania 59, Princeton 58

PRINCETON, N.J., Jan. 13 (AP) — Bobby Willis sank four free throws in the final 41 seconds to send Pennsylvania to a 59-58 overtime victory over Princeton tonight.

James Salters hit a layup and three free throws in the overtime period, which was marked by perfect foul shooting by both Princeton, 4 for 4, and Penn, 5 for 5.

Indiana State 93, Bradley 74

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Jan. 13 (AP) — Larry Bird scored a game-high 27 points tonight to lead Indiana State to a 93-74 triumph over Bradley in a Missouri Valley Conference game.

The 6-foot-9-inch Bird had 18 rebounds and 10 assists as the unbeaten Sycamores increased their record to 13-0 over all and 4-0 in conference play. Other Indiana State players in double figures were Carl Nicks with 24 points and Brad Miley with 10.

North Carolina 74, Duke 68

CHAPEL HILL, N.C., Jan. 13 (AP) — Mike O'Koren and Al Wood put in 17 points each, and Dudley Bradley stole the ball at opportune times to lead North Carolina to a 74-68 triumph over Duke.

Duke had a 1-point lead at halftime, but North Carolina outscored the Blue Devils by 12-4 in the first five minutes of the second half.

Duke pulled back to within 1 point after Mike Gminski, who finished with a game-high 22 points, made two baskets and three free throws. But the Tar Heels stayed ahead and led by 9 points, 59-50, with 7:51 left.

Bradley and O'Koren kept scoring for North Carolina in the last five minutes after the Tar Heels went briefly into a four-comers offense.

R.I. 95, St. Bonaventure 67

BINGHAMTON, N.Y., Jan. 13 (AP) — Sly Williams scored 26 points to lead Rhode Island to a 95-67 victory over St. Bonaventure today.

The St. Bonaventure coach, Jim Satalin, called Rhode Island, now 12-2, "the best team in the East right now."

Yale 58, Fairfield 57

FAIRFIELD, Conn., Jan. 13 (AP) — A jump shot by Andy Fleming with five seconds left gave Yale a 58-57 victory over Fairfield University today.

Fleming, a 6-foot-8-inch junior, scored on a 18-foot shot from the corner after his first attempt had been blocked by Fairfield's Mark Young. Yale is now 4-6.

Fairfield had taken the lead with 23 seconds remaining on Joe DeSantis's 15-foot jump shot. DeSantis led all scorers with 22 points.

Fairfield had a final opportunity after Fleming's basket, but Yale's 5-9 guard, Larry Zigerelli, stole the ball to secure the victory.

Notre Dame 65, Marquette 60

MILWAUKEE, Jan. 13 (AP) — Tracy Jackson rallied second-ranked Notre Dame from a 7-point deficit to a 65-60 victory over 13th-ranked Marquette tonight as the sophomore reserve scored 13 of his 21 points in the second half.

Purdue 52, Mich. State 50

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind., Jan. 13 (AP) — Arnette Hallman's 23-foot jump shot at the buzzer today gave Purdue 52-50 upset victory over Michigan State in the Big Ten.

Purdue's junior center, Joe Barry Carroll, had game-high totals of 27 points and 11 rebounds as the Boilermakers evened their conference record at 2-2 and climbed to 12-4 over all.

Michigan State, 9-3 and 2-2, trailed for most of the game. With 4:31 left, David Charles hit two free throws, giving the Spartans their first lead at 47-46. A free throw by Michigan State's Earvin Johnson made it 48-46 before Carroll tied the score with a reverse drive underneath.
