

Syracuse Conquers Rhode Island, 64-54

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Jan. 11 (AP) — Roosevelt Bouie and Louie Orr combined for 37 points tonight as unbeaten Syracuse recorded a 64-54 victory over Rhode Island.

The triumph leaves Syracuse, ranked fifth in the nation by both wire-service polls this week, with a 13-0 won-lost record. Rhode Island slipped to 8-3.

Syracuse had trouble with Rhode Island's man-to-man defense and trailed the Rams at the half, 32-31, only the third time this season the Orangemen have trailed at halftime. Rhode Island forced 13 turnovers in the first half, before the Orange straightened themselves out.

Orr, a 6-foot-8 inch forward, dropped

in 20 points to lead all scorers. Bouie, a 6-11 center, had 17 points. For Rhode Island, Jimmy Wright and Phil Kydd each had 11 points.

Pennsylvania 64, Brown 47

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 11 (AP) — Paul Little, a freshman, scored 16 points as Pennsylvania defeated Brown 64-47 tonight in an Ivy League game at the Palestra.

Little connected on eight of 11 field-goal attempts as Penn never trailed after taking a 4-3 lead. Ted Flick finished with 10 points for the Quakers, who are now 5-4 after dropping their first four games of the season. Brown is now 4-8.

Princeton 65, Yale 57

PRINCETON, N.J., Jan. 11 — Steve Mills, a sophomore guard, tossed in a game and career-high 19 points, 15 in the second half, to pace Princeton to a 65-57 Ivy League victory over Yale at Jadwin Gymnasium and snap the Tigers' six-game losing streak.

Mills, a substitute, scored 7 straight points early in the second half to give Princeton (3-11) a 41-32 edge. Yale (3-4), led by Tim Daaleman's 15 points, never trailed by fewer than 6 points thereafter.

Columbia 85, Harvard 63

Kurt Mahoney scored 19 of his game-high 25 points in the second half last night as Columbia opened its Ivy League season with a 85-63 victory over Harvard at Levien Gym.

The Lions, who scored 7 of the last 9 points of the first half to take a 32-28 lead, shot an impressive 86 percent from the floor in the second half, hitting on 18 of 21 field-goal attempts.

Mahoney made all 12 of his shots in the second half — seven from the floor and five from the foul line — to lead the Lions. He was one of four Columbia players to score in double figures. Richie Gordon had 19, Kevin Best added 14 and Dave Westenburg 10.

The victory raised the Lions' record to 5-4. Harvard, 4-7 overall and 0-2 in the Ivy League, was led by Mark Harris's 19 points.
