

Syracuse Rolls Over Northwestern, 42-21

SYRACUSE, Sept. 27 (AP) — Joe Morris ran for 172 yards, and Dave Warner scored three touchdowns as Syracuse University defeated Northwestern, 42-21, in college football today.

Warner, the junior quarterback, opened the scoring with a 53-yard run on the third play from scrimmage. He later scored on runs of 16 yards and 1 yard. The triumph gave Syracuse a 2-1 record.

Morris became the No. 2 ground gainer in Syracuse history on his first carry when he broke loose for 20 yards. The junior running back, who scored on an 8-yard run, left the game with 2,865 career yards, only 69 behind Larry Csonka's career record.

Mike Kerrigan provided Northwestern (0-4) with its offense, setting single-game school passing records by completing 25 of 39 pass attempts for 269 yards. Kerrigan passed for three touchdowns, hitting Todd Jenkins twice and Todd Sheets once.

Glenn Moore, the Syracuse freshman, excited the 34,739 spectators in the Carrier Dome by running 30 yards for a touchdown late in the game. Moore wears No. 44, the jersey made famous by past Syracuse backs Floyd Little, Ernie Davis and Jim Brown.

Ken Mandeville also scored on a 1-yard run for Syracuse.

After earlier drives ended 1 and 8

yards short of the goal line, Northwestern scored its first touchdown on a 12-yard pass play to Jenkins in the last two seconds of the first half.

Washington State 31, Army 18

PULLMAN, Wash., Sept. 27 (UPI) — Samoa Samoa scored on runs of 22 and 28 yards today to lead Washington State to a 31-18 triumph over Army.

Samoa directed Washington State on three touchdown drives, making good use of pitches to his running backs.

Jerryl Bennett, the Army quarterback, passed for 247 yards and a touchdown.

Washington State (1-2) took a 21-0 lead in the second quarter, one of the scores coming on Samoa's 22-yard run. The Cougars also scored in the first half on short runs by Robert Williams and Mike Washington.

Army (1-2) scored with 6:14 left in the first half when Bennett connected on a 15-yard pass to Mike Fahnestock. Dave Aucoin kicked a 27-yard field goal with 27 seconds left to cut the deficit to 21-10 at halftime.

Arizona 31, California 24

BERKELEY, Calif., Sept. 27 (AP) — Arizona scored three touchdowns in the fourth quarter, the last on a 10-yard run by Hubert Oliver, to gain a 31-24 victory over California today.

Arizona (1-1) turned back a final

drive by the Golden Bears as Sam Giangardella recovered a California fumble on the Arizona 2-yard line with 1:19 left.

California (0-3) took a 24-10 lead into the fourth quarter, having scored on 1-yard runs by Dave Palmer and Rick Campbell, a 15-yard pass from Campbell to John Tuggle and a field goal by Mick Luckhurst.

Arizona's comeback began early in the fourth quarter when Dave Liggins intercepted near midfield. Two plays later, Mark Fulcher hit Bob Carter with a 45-yard touchdown pass. On the next series, Bill Redman blocked Mike Ahr's punt deep in Cal territory, and Gary Gibson picked up the ball and ran 15 yards for the tying touchdown. Reggie Ware positioned the winning drive with an interception and 38-yard runback to the California 35.

U.C.L.A. 35, Wisconsin 0

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 27 (AP) — Kevin Nelson gained 123 yards on 20 carries and scored a touchdown as the University of California, Los Angeles, overpowered Wisconsin, 35-0, today.

Nelson, a freshman, was filling in for the injured Freeman McNeil. Nelson had gained only 40 yards in U.C.L.A.'s first two games, but he surpassed that total early in leading the Bruins to their third consecutive victory. Wisconsin (0-3) has yet to score a touchdown.

U.C.L.A. scored two touchdowns in

each of the first two quarters for a 28-0 halftime lead. Nelson passed for 114 yards in the first half and did not play in the final quarter.

McNeil, the country's third-leading rusher last year with an average of 139.6 yards a game, sat out because of a bruised right knee.

Oregon 34, Washington 10

SEATTLE, Sept. 27 (UPI) — Reggie Ogburn ran for two touchdowns and passed for another today to lead Oregon to a 34-10 upset victory over Washington.

Ogburn put the Ducks ahead, 13-10, with an 8-yard touchdown pass to Curt Jackson in the third quarter. He ran 3 yards for another score early in the fourth quarter to put Oregon ahead, 20-10.

Lehigh 35, Penn 6

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 27 (AP) — Larry Michalski passed for one touchdown and ran for a second to lead Lehigh to a 35-6 victory over Pennsylvania last night.

Lehigh, the Division 1-AA runner-up last year, raised its record to 2-0-1, while Penn dropped to 0-2.

The Engineers opened the scoring on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Michalski to Mark Yeager in the first quarter. In the fourth quarter, Michalski took a lateral from Steve Plucinsky and scored from 9 yards out.
