

Boston College Triumphs Over Yale, 27-9

NEWTOWN, Mass., Oct. 11 — John Loughery, the Boston College quarterback, broke open the Yale defense tonight by completing 13 passes for 253 yards and two touchdowns as the Eagles defeated the Elis, 27-9, before a crowd of 26,000 at Alumni Stadium.

Loughery's 71-yard pass to Jon Schoen, his split end, gave the Eagles a 14-0 lead in the second period. Another pass, Loughery to Rob Rikard, was good for 46 yards and the home team's last touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Yale's scores came on a 37-yard field goal by Tony Jones in the second period and a 5-yard touchdown run by the fullback, John Nitti, at the start of the final quarter.

That score completed Yale's only deep penetration into Boston College territory as the Elis had trouble mounting a consistent offense. This touchdown cut the Eagles' lead and made the score, 17-9. But Boston College's John Cooper then kicked his second field goal and Loughery completed his long pass to Rikard.

The victory was Boston College's second against three defeats while Yale lost for the first time after winning its first three games.

The favored Eagles did not have an

easy time against a Yale defense led by the middle guard, Kevin Czinger. The Boston College running attack gained 88 yards, and 27 came on a touchdown run by Shelby Gamble, the tailback, in the first quarter.

Gamble swept to his left on the first offensive play after Mike Maycock had intercepted a pass by John Rogan, the Yale quarterback. Rogan had trouble escaping the Boston College pass rush and was dropped for losses four times in the first half.

Phil Manley, the second Yale quarterback, did much better and escaped this rush while completing five passes for 62 yards.

Manley was the quarterback through most of the second half for the Elis. His fourth-down pass to Kurt Grieve to the Eagle 6-yard line set up the score by Nitti.

Loughery's long pass to Schoen had given Boston College a 14-3 lead at half-time. But Loughery, too, had trouble with the pass rush and was tackled four times for a total loss of 35 yards.

Rich Diana, the leading Yale offensive threat, gained 83 yards rushing and completed one pass that kept the Elis moving. But Yale had difficulty on

third-down plays and missed making the needed first down on 16 of 19 such plays.

Brown 42, Penn 22

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Oct. 11 (AP) — Rick Villella and Steve Curtin scored two touchdowns apiece, and Larry Carbone threw for two touchdowns as Brown defeated Penn, 42-22, today in an Ivy League game.

W. and M. 17, Dartmouth 14

WILLIAMSBURG, Va., Oct. 11 (AP) — Chris Garrity plunged over for the winning touchdown after setting it up with a pass completion today as William and Mary gained its first victory, 17-14, over Dartmouth.

Tom Franco had collected 21 of his 120 yards rushing for the day in the winning 56-yard drive that was set up when Bo Short recovered a fumble by Dartmouth's quarterback, Jeff Kemp.

Although Dartmouth (1-3) held the lead through three quarters, its offense was constantly stalled.

Boston U. 35, Davidson 14

BOSTON, Oct. 11 (AP) — Gregg Drew, a sophomore tailback, rushed for a career high 175 yards on 22 carries today as Boston University beat Davidson, 35-14.

Jim Jensen completed nine of 14 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns as the Terriers posted their fourth victory against one loss.
