

Columbia Is Routed By 48-0

HANOVER, N. H., Nov. 8 — Dartmouth scored touchdowns three of the first four times it had the ball and coasted to a 48-0 victory over Columbia in an Ivy League game today.

The triumph, coupled with Cornell's upset victory against Yale, kept the Big Green in the Ivy League title race. Yale leads the conference at 4-1, and Dartmouth is in a four-way tie for second place with a 3-2 mark with two games remaining.

Dartmouth dominated the game, picking up 489 yards, including 322 on the ground. It held the Lions to a total of 169 yards. Columbia was forced to punt seven times; Dartmouth's kicking was limited to extra points, kickoffs and one missed field-goal attempt by Tim Geibel.

Dartmouth needed eight plays after the opening kickoff to march 73 yards for its first score, with Jeff Kemp, the quarterback, hitting Dave Shula with a 3-yard pass in the left corner of the end zone.

After Columbia held on a fourth-and-2 at its 18-yard line the next time the Big Green had the ball, Dartmouth drove 41 yards on five plays on its third possession, with Jeff Dufresne going over the middle from the 1-yard line for the score. Dartmouth opened a 21-0 lead early in the second period on a second 1-yard touchdown by Dufresne, capping a 50-yard, 14-play drive.

Dartmouth continued its assault in the second half, with Mark Akey scoring twice on 1-yard runs in the third period and Bill Spalding and Sean Maher scoring on runs of 1 and 36 yards, respectively, in the fourth period. For each it was a first career touchdown.

Columbia, which dropped its sixth straight game and saw its record fall to 1-7, made its deepest penetration in the first half to the Dartmouth 37-yard line, on the last play of the half. The Lions reached the Big Green's 20 late in the fourth quarter before losing the ball on a fumble by Mark Lincoln.

Villanova 34, Penn 3

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 8 (AP) — Pat O'Brien threw a 38-yard scoring pass to Tim Robinson to help Villanova post a 34-3 triumph over Penn at Franklin Field today in the first meeting of the schools since 1911.

The pass to Robinson, with 7:24 elapsed in the first quarter, was the game's first score. Chuck Bushbeck added the extra point.

Villanova (4-5) increased its lead to 14-0 later in the first quarter on a 2-yard touchdown run by Shawn Peggman.
